1. Lala Rural College is affiliated to Assam University, Silchar and is going to implement the NEP 2020 structure of curriculum from the ensuing session as per the Assam University Guidelines. 2. The structure of NEP 2020, Assam University, Silchar as implemented in affiliated colleges, has inbuilt component of multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary approach. 3. Clustering of Colleges and exchange of faculties for facilitating multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary approach is already in place.

16. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The College being affiliated to Assam University, Silchar, its students are being registered in Academic Bank of Credit portal as per university guidelines.

17. Skill development:

In regard to soft skill development and entrepreneurship development, the college has signed MoU with Cooperative Societies, Hailakandi, Govt of Assam. And accordingly, a Common Services Center was formed and to that end a cooperative society has already been constituted with 51 students as members with one Nodal Teacher and applied for seed money through Cooperative Society, Hailakandi in online mode. 15 days - long computer training course from 21st May 2022 to 4th June 2022 was organized by Vocational Training and Life skill Development Cell for skill development and employment for students. Sports skill development through Women's' Hockey as per Memorandum of Understanding with DSA, Hailakandi was ensured. So far, more than 36 girls have been appointed in different departments under government of Assam especially in the Police departments. Recently, one students of the college name Miss Roma Singha has been selected in the under 19 Hockey Team of the state of Assam. The college is looking forward and committed to improve its sports facilities.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

The institution adopts a Comprehensive Internal Assessment Mechanism to evaluate the learning levels of the students. Before taking up the syllabi, teachers try to assess the basic knowledge of the individual student about the course chosen. The students are continuously evaluated not just on the basis of their scores in class tests, unit tests and end semester examinations, but also on the basis of level of participation and responsiveness during class by individual teachers. From time to time, assignments on different topics are given to the students to gauge their depth of understanding of the subjects taught during class. Students are then categorized into advanced and slow learners based on their performance in all the aforementioned attributes. For the advanced learners, career counselling, discussion on advanced topics, group discussions and seminars are organized at departmental level. They are encouraged to undertake additional academic assignments and read more reference books and related materials outside the syllabus. Peer-teaching is also encouraged so that there is mutual benefit. Similarly, for the slow learners, remedial or extra classes are arranged. Guidance through mentoring sessions and one to one counselling is also provided to nurture the students by addressing their academic and stress related issues.

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

The college has been consistently trying to inculcate more and more student-centric approaches to make learning a pleasurable exercise. For real time exposure, students are encouraged to participate in educational tours, field visits and surveys. Additionally, Faculty Exchange Programmes are organized to supplement the teaching learning process and provide experiential learning. In participative learning, teachers make classes as interactive as possible. Group discussions under the guidance of teachers are conducted; wherein the ideas and views of each student is explored. The students are encouraged to participate in activities organized by various cells like NSS, Students' Welfare Cell, etc. Besides, extra-curricular activities like cultural events and competitions, print magazines, and wall magazines also promote the scope of experiential and participative learning. Moreover, students are always encouraged to participate in various activities and programmes organized from time to time such as quizzes, classroom seminars, workshops, awareness programmes, training programmes, etc. for their overall development. Some of the students of the college have also participated in National Level Events and earned accolade. To foster teamwork as well as problem solving skills, students participate in group activities that call for collaboration, consensus-building, and communication to address challenging situations.

The college is continuously working on developing a robust IT infrastructure for use in the teaching learning process. At present it is equipped with some basic digital infrastructural devices such as computers, digital pena-boards, reprographic machines, printers, projectors, etc. The institute also has 24x7 Wi-fi facility in the campus for the faculty members and students (library) to avail internet connection to access the resources required for teaching learning purpose. Besides these, the teachers have been using online platforms for classes and other purposes like class tests, assignments, communication, providing study material, taking feedback, etc. To share their teaching experiences, faculty members utilize tools such as PowerPoint presentations, video clips, films, and other resources. To access advanced and exceptional information, teachers make use of electronic resources. Further, the faculty members guide the students regarding self-learning portals like Swayam. The institute has its own online portal, which is being used efficiently for admission of new students as well as for student support including registration and online form fill-up before examinations. Notwithstanding the College ICT Framework, the teachers have laptops, tablets with web connectivity in their own level and use these devices for making teaching learning process effective and interesting.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

To ensure transparency, the college communicates entire evaluation procedure for internal assessment, including the rules and regulations of the affiliating university, to the students. Regular departmental assessments are conducted through class tests, assignments, and other means for continuous evaluation. Model questions and marking schemes are explained using previous years' final examination question papers. Internal assessment consists of one periodic test, student attendance for all departments, and practical paper assignments for the commerce department. The academic calendar, available in the prospectus, informs students in advance about the likely month of unit test, allowing them to plan their studies accordingly. A proper routine is prepared for the unit test, which is conducted under the supervision of invigilator(s). After evaluation, marks and assessment copies are shown to the students with prior suggestions and to identify any discrepancies. All records and data on attendance, question papers, answer sheets/copies, and summary of marks sheets are maintained by departments for academic monitoring. Academic counseling is conducted based on students' progress, and departmental-level meetings as well as parent-teacher meetings are organized for student performance reviews. Remedial classes are arranged as required. Finally, internal assessment marks are submitted to the university for the declaration of end-semester results.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time- bound and efficient

The college has a well-organized mechanism for addressing grievances related to internal examinations, which is transparent, time-bound, and efficient. Throughout the semester, various class tests are conducted at the departmental level, with Unit Test-I being particularly significant as part of the Internal Assessment. The teachers evaluate the papers within a week of the test. The evaluated answer sheets are then shown to the students in class, and individual grievances are addressed, including pointing out any mistakes that may have contributed to scores below expectations. The unit test marks are calculated and displayed on the notice board, and any discrepancies reported by students regarding the marks are promptly resolved by the respective department. Most issues are resolved at the departmental level, but if a matter cannot be resolved at this level, students have the option to approach the Grievance Redressal Cell, IQAC to address the matter as needed. In exceptional cases where there are discrepancies between the marks given by teachers and those recorded in the university's mark sheets, the college assists students in correcting such errors.

The stated programmes are displayed on the college website for the awareness and easy accessibility of the students. Before starting each class, teachers first give a brief idea about the course. The basic overall concept is summarized in a concise manner so that the students get familiar with the course. The course outcomes are also discussed in a wholesome manner so that the students realize the

importance and applications of those in different areas of day-today life. This not only provides information but also sparks greater interest in the subject, motivating students to make personal efforts to grasp the curriculum concepts better.

Students' performance and participation in these assessments determine their overall attainment levels. Students with low attainment level are provided with remedial measures such as mentorship, tutorials, and remedial classes are provided to weak students, with some advanced learners encouraged to mentor their peers.

Additionally, the college considers two parameters to assess POs and COs: the number of students progressing to higher studies and the number of students employed (self or otherwise) after completing their courses. These parameters reflect the attainment of POs and COs, with employment being a particularly significant indicator. Moreover, the college has a feedback mechanism in place to collect feedback from students, teachers, and alumni. Overall, these assessment methods and feedback mechanisms ensure that the college maintains a high standard of education and continuously strives for improvement.
