## Concept Note

Northeast India, known for its ecological and cultural diversity, holds rich indigenous knowledge systems shaped by generations of interaction with nature and community life. These include herbal healing, sustainable agriculture, crafts, oral traditions and ecological wisdom, yet they remain underdocumented within the Indian Knowledge System (IKS). The Two-day National Seminar on "Narratives of Indigenous Knowledge and Innovation: Language, Culture and Development in Northeast India" aims to highlight these traditions and their importance in Contemporary debates on knowledge and sustainable development. With rapid modernisation and the continued colonial trend of marginalisation of non-Western philosophy, preserving these practices is increasingly urgent.

Providing an interdisciplinary platform, the seminar explores how language, culture, identity and community innovation shape indigenous knowledge in the region. It brings together scholars, practitioners and community representatives, aligning with NEP 2020, UNDRIP and the SDGs to promote decolonised and inclusive development.
